Provision of Hope Highlights in 2025

- **EDUCATION** - We enrolled close to 100 K-12 students again this year.
UNIVERSITY, COLLEGE, AND TRADE SCHOOLS - we have 3 in Nursing School, 2 taking Physician's Assistant, 2 in university becoming teachers, and several in Trade Schools. Many graduations again!
- **4 CHILDREN'S HOMES** – Dapae & Rita, Ottis & Benetta, Ma Esther's Home with John & Korpu, and Eric & Kamah are all doing an excellent job of raising their children. They are raising leaders! We sure appreciate Darlyn Richards, a social worker and youth counsellor, who works closely with our youth.
- **SINGLE MOTHERS** – we are always helping the desperate ones. We empower them to run small businesses or go to trade schools so they can provide for themselves. We are there to encourage our moms to care well for their children.
- **EMPOWERMENT PROGRAMS** – include Trade Schools and Business Start-ups
- **MICRO LOANS** – This is the way forward for so many Liberians to rise above poverty. We have given out over 210 “interest-free” microloans. Our loans range from \$300 to \$4,000. We have a screening process and loan only to those who are reaching out to others. We are happy with the results.
- **ORGANIC AGRICULTURE** - We continue to train farming groups and students in rural schools that have garden land. To date, we have trained 16 groups/schools. We are partnered with Thrive www.thriveforgood.org. This is a giant step towards ending poverty and food insecurity, adding so much nutrition to their diets. They are experiencing less sickness, especially those who eat moringa.
- **WIDOWS**– Over 600 Widows get a monthly supply of rice, oil, and soup mixes in 7 different areas of Liberia. We appreciate Wordsower International USA for their partnership with our Widows.
- **MAT TO MATTRESS**– we continue to buy quality mattresses for those on poor, thin sponges or mats.
- **OUTREACH TO THE POOR** We bring rice and medical supplies to those in extreme conditions, in rural villages and slums. We regularly bring supplies to an orphanage in Bomi.
- **MEDICAL TREATMENT** -We have taken many poor to hospitals and clinics again this year.
- **EVANGELISM** – We keep introducing people to Jesus and buying more Bibles.
